May 2023 School Transport

If your child has an EHCP you should have received a letter about transport arrangements for the next school year, that is from September 2023.

For children and young people going through a phased transition to a new provision, the deadline for applications is 9th June.

Travel assistance for compulsory school age children:

If your circumstances have not changed, you do not need to reapply if any of the following are relevant:

l) you have received a letter advising you that your child's travel arrangement will be renewed automatically.

2) Your child's school placement will be the same from September and your child is currently receiving travel assistance.

Travel assistance for Post-16 education:

You will need to make a new application if:

l) you are starting Post-16 education.

2) you have already had 3 years Post-16 assistance.

3) you are changing placement.
